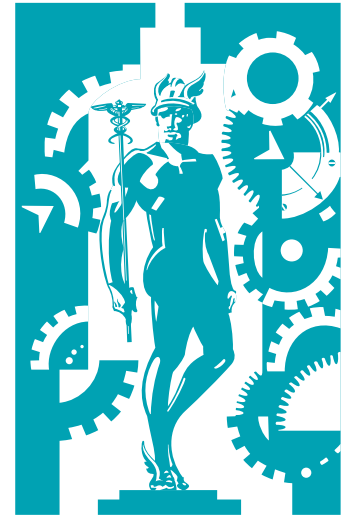

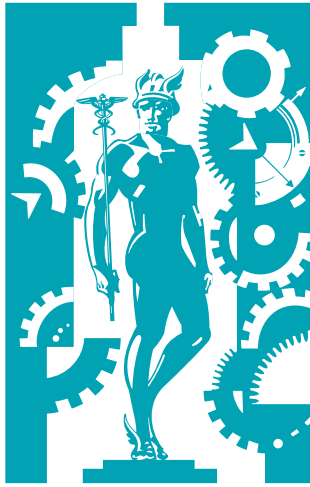

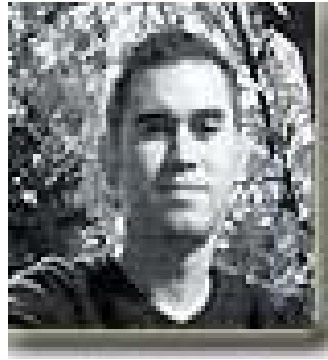

ECLIPSES

Eclipses of the Sun or Moon occur when the light is hidden by another body. In olden times people feared the

disappearance of the Sun God or Moon Goddess. They thought these were omens of terrible times to come. Today eclipses observed by astrologers take on a different meaning. An eclipse signals a time to take a careful look at the issues of the houses where the eclipse occurs. The month of May has two eclipses.

LUNAR ECLIPSE May 15, 2003 @ 11:36 p.m. EDT 24º Scorpio 53'

A lunar eclipse occurs when the Earth passes between the Sun and Moon casting a shadow on the Moon. If we were to go out at night we would see the shadow of the Earth cross the Moon. The Sun would be behind us below the horizon.

During a lunar eclipse we are concerned with our emotional state and the earthly events that create those feelings. Our ego is behind us, and we cannot quite be objective about things.

The Sabian symbol for the Moon during this eclipse is *An X-ray photograph*. The house where the Moon lies in our chart will expose emotions about issues that we have been keeping hidden from ourselves.

Mercury goes direct in Taurus, the house opposite the lunar eclipse. We should have a lot of good information about the issues surrounding these two houses. Saturn is finishing up his stay in

Gemini. The symbol for Saturn during the eclipse is *Society granting bankruptcy to him, a man leaves the court.* We may not be bankrupt, but we should have become clear about old emotions and behaviors. This information will allow us to view the Taurus/Scorpio area of our charts in a new way so that we can make changes.

SOLAR ECLIPSE

May 31, 2003
@ 00:20 a.m. EDT
09° Gemini 29'

A solar eclipse occurs when the Moon passes between the Sun and the Earth. For a few minutes the Sun "disappears." We have the opportunity to focus on issues of the house where Gemini resides in our chart.

The Sabian symbol is *An aeroplane performing a nose-dive.* We are the pilot, and

we can control the nose-dive and make it an exciting and challenging adventure or allow the events of the house to end in a crash. The decanate and dwad are Mercury and Saturn. We have the ability to manage the energy of this solar eclipse.

Bernadette Brady in The Eagle and the Lark writes:

"A very unusual Saros Series involving sudden flashes of ideas that seem to have a psychic or unconscious flavor to them. Hunches, visions,

prophetic dreams are the essence of this family of eclipses. A truly creative series, which should leave the individual enriched. The ideas or hunches, which come from the eclipse, can be acted upon."

Saturn will enter Cancer four days later on June 4th. It is time to nurture those ideas. Mercury will be back to 20° Taurus on June 5th and out of its shadow. This is a good time to begin to move forward with new ideas.
